COMMUNITY SERVICES: SUPPORT FOR CARERS



We can support carers in their caring role and through bereavement across several services.

Caring for someone when they have a palliative illness can be very difficult. Whether someone calls themselves a carer or not, providing support or care for a friend or family member who has been diagnosed with a palliative illness or someone who is approaching the end of their life can be an overwhelming experience. It can be especially difficult for those living with the person they are caring for. Many carers say that they feel a constant anxiety about the person they care for and sometimes these feelings impact their ability to live a normal life.

If you are caring for someone with a palliative illness, help and support is available at Southern Area Hospice

Services. The Caring Well, Thinking Well 3 week group programme allows carers to take some time to themselves, connect with others in similar circumstances and talk in confidence to our team. The programme is available in Dungannon and Newry. Visit our website for dates and how to sign up.

Carers can also avail of counselling and reflexology sessions.

Shelia started working in Southern Area Hospice Services when it was the St. John of God Hospital and owned by the Sisters of St John of God. Shelia assisted the nurses on the maternity, surgical, and medical floors, serving meals and looking after new-born babies. Sheila took up a full-time post in 1976 working as a receptionist and then as P.A. to the CEO and Medical Director, and continued working here for 26 years, through the transition in 1989 from a maternity hospital to the Newry and Mourne Hospice.

Sheila now works in reception and loves her job, she said "The role of a receptionist can be emotionally and mentally demanding at times but very, very rewarding. You are dealing with all walks of life and all kinds of situations and a smiling face, a kind word to a person or patient arriving means so much." In her role she

gets to meet a wide variety of people who give generously to the Hospice. Sheila shares, "I do hear some sad and great stories as to how and why people wanted to fundraise for us.". Shelia always greets our visitors and patients with a warm smile and a quick "hello, how can I help". She always gives anyone who comes through the doors whatever time they need to talk, reminisce, or gather their emotions while reassuring them. "To those kind people who arrive at Hospice to donate, she reminds them, "this is not our Hospice it is your Hospice because without you we could not continue this wonderful work."
